Pioneers Park includes over 288 acres of green space including sports fields, trails, bridle paths, playground areas, shelters and a large hill for sledding in the winter. The Pioneers Golf Course (179 acres) located on the northwest side of the park is one of the oldest courses in Lincoln. Pioneers Park is also home to Pinewood Bowl.

Discover Nebraska's largest climbing and bouldering gym, a three-story 2,383 sq. ft. space with 30 rope lines. Rent gear for all adventures—bikes to explore the city trails; canoes, kayaks and paddleboards for nearby waterways; and tents and coolers for camping. Cross-country ski rentals available in winter.



Holmes Lake

A man-made lake is the center feature of Holmes Park and is a Lincoln favorite. The park also offers ball diamonds, a playground, an 18-hole public golf course and the Hyde Memorial Observatory. In winter, part of the lake is cleared of snow for ice skating and sleds fill the hills.

The Outdoor Education Center is a fully-staffed shooting facility focusing on educating people of all ages about shooting sports. They provide the equipment and the instruction in archery, handgun and rifle. A climate controlled indoor firearm range is available for those ages eight and over. The archery range is available for ages six and over. Personal archery, crossbow and firearm up to 30-06 rifle and 44 Mag handgun are welcome. The Outdoor Education Center is a great option for fun after 12 pm with friends, family, teams and corporate groups.

Twenty minutes southwest of Lincoln, Spring Creek Prairie Audubon Center offers prairie, wetland and woodland habitats; miles of walking trails; a straw-bale constructed visitor center and trail ruts from the Nebraska City-Fort Kearny Cutoff of the Oregon Trail.
